## Rikers con to sue city for \$1M

ATTORNEYS FOR AN inmate who was allegedly beaten during a clash with correction officers on Rikers Island have served the city with a notice to file a \$1 million lawsuit.

The lawyers also say that as many as 13 other inmates were beaten — many while handcuffed — in a violent retaliatory strike on Oct. 5 after an officer was slashed on the face.

“Correction officers have a tough job, but they are professionals,” said Leo Glickman,

a Brooklyn attorney. “Retaliating against powerless, handcuffed inmates. . . is indefensible.”

The notice to sue was filed yesterday on behalf of Born Poledore, 24, a Brooklyn ex-con jailed on a stolen property charge.

“These are allegations made by an attorney who intends to sue the city on behalf of inmates,” said city Department of Correction spokesman Tom Antenen. “Nonetheless, we are conducting an investigation.” Robert F. Moore
